JUNE 10, 2017 IS THE 2ND ANNUAL “WESTSOUND SAVE A LIFE MARCH”

Last year on September 10, 2016, in collaboration with Harrison Hospital, I facilitated the “WestSound Save a Life March” to bring awareness to the critical emergencies that happen within our community. More importantly, this march was and is about celebrating survivors of critical emergencies, including: Stroke/CVA, Cardiac Arrest, Heart Attacks, and many other life-threatening emergencies. The purpose of this march is to bring awareness to these medical events and what we as a community can do to help set these patients up for successful outcomes.

June 10, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. (Booths open at 8:30 a.m.) will be the 2nd annual “WestSound Save a Life March,” and I will be expanding upon the concept of the original march that took place last year. We will perform a live demonstration of a Sudden Cardiac Arrest that will take place on stage at the Silverdale Mall parking lot near Kohl’s. The following will be performed:

- Bystander CPR by a civilian.
- CENCOM actually being called by the civilian.
- PulsePoint will go off for everyone in the crowd who has it downloaded.
- Actual deployment of 51 units from Station 51 responding priority (M51, E51, L51, BC51).
- High-performance resuscitation performed by Firehouse 51 units.
- Handover of care to Harrison Hospital Bremerton ER staff.
- Immediately following the event, I will summarize the entire chain of survival and how important bystander CPR and AED deployment are in the Chain of Survival.
- Following the summary, we will organize the audience for the march up to Silverdale Harrison Hospital and back to the mall. Engine 51 and Ladder/Rescue 51 will be leading and protecting the march.

Take this opportunity to join us on June 10th to participate in the march and to watch the live performance while learning more about:

- Stroke Awareness
- Hands-Only CPR and AED Deployment
- Sepsis
- PulsePoint

I look forward to seeing you at the event and to participating in a worthy cause that directly affects the community’s health and well-being.

TONY HIDALGO RETIRES

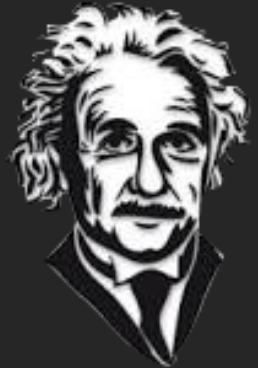
On Tuesday, Admin Staff celebrated the career of Tony Hidalgo (on the right), the Custodian employed by the Water District, who is retiring after 11 years!
