






## **GARAGE FIRE**

#### THIS WEEK IN FIRE HISTORY


On June 6, 1889, the **Great Seattle Fire** destroyed the entire central business district of Seattle. The fire burned for several hours, destroying 25 blocks and causing as much as \$20 million in damage (that would be about \$527 million today). As a result, the streets in the Pioneer Square neighborhood were elevated 22 feet above the pre-fire street level and new buildings made of wood were banned.
