Kidde Product Safety Recall Notice: Plastic Handle & Push-Button Fire Extinguishers


Central Kitsap Fire and Rescue encourages everyone to check their home and vehicle extinguishers on the heels of the following news from major manufacturer Kidde ...

I wanted to let you know the sad news that Karl Grahn, an original member and retired Assistance Chief of Fire Dist. 15, passed away early last week. My family received the news late last week that Karl had suffered another stroke and did not recover. Karl's smile, even, after his many strokes, was contagious, along with his laugh.

Karl was a fixture throughout the local Brownsville and Gilberton area, cooking lefse and enjoying pickled herring. His family, Grandfather Carl, was an original homesteader in Gilberton around 1890, naming it Grahn Cove. His family has always served the community, from running a Mosquito Fleet ferry before there were roads, to his son serving the citizens as a Bremerton Fire Captain (Raymond "Buck"). Karl was a member of the Brownsville Fire Department from the early 1950's until his retirement in the mid 1990's, helping build the Brownsville station in 1952.





PCORI Fee Increase

The PCORI fee is increasing from \$2.26 to \$2.39 for the plan year ending September 30, 2018. We deduct this fee from your participants' accounts and pay it to the federal government.

Spouse/Dependent Integration Rules

We've helped make this easy for you. Spouse/dependent integration rules became effective October 1, 2017 for the HRA VEBA Plan.

No IRS Form W-2 Tax Reporting

You are not required to report HRA VEBA Plan coverage on IRS Form W-2 for the 2017 tax year. IRS Notice 2012-9 confirmed that coverage under a health reimbursement arrangement (HRA) is excludable from Form W-2 reporting. This guidance remains in effect until further notice from the IRS.

My Care CardSM Fee Going Away

Good news! No more \$1-per-month My Care Card fee in 2018. The VEBA Board recently approved removal of the fee effective January 1, 2018. This will benefit

thousands of participants. Notification to participants will be included with their account statements in January.

PCORI Fee Increase

The Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) fee is set to increase from \$2.26 to \$2.39 for the plan year ending September 30, 2018. We deduct a prorated portion of this fee from your participants' accounts each quarter. Collected fees are paid to the federal government every July. The PCORI fee is expected to continue through the plan year ending in 2019.

Spouse/Dependent Integration Rules

Beginning October 1, 2017, spouses and dependents of HRA VEBA Plan participants must be covered under your (or another) group health plan at the time they incur a medical care expense. If not, the expense cannot be reimbursed. This new requirement under federal healthcare reform applies only to your actively-employed participants under the Standard HRA Plan.

Don't worry! We have revised the Claim Form and online claims process to help you and your participants comply with this new rule as it relates to the HRA VEBA Plan. Participants now confirm spouse and dependent coverage when they submit claims. You do not have to track or maintain this information with respect to your employees' HRA VEBA Plan coverage.
