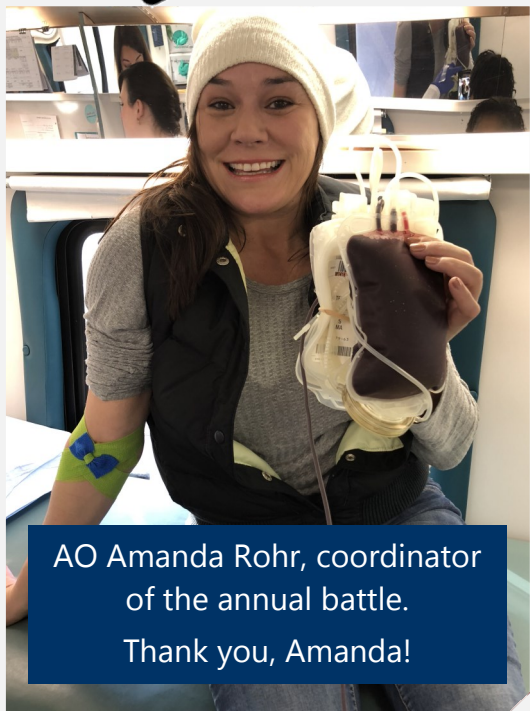

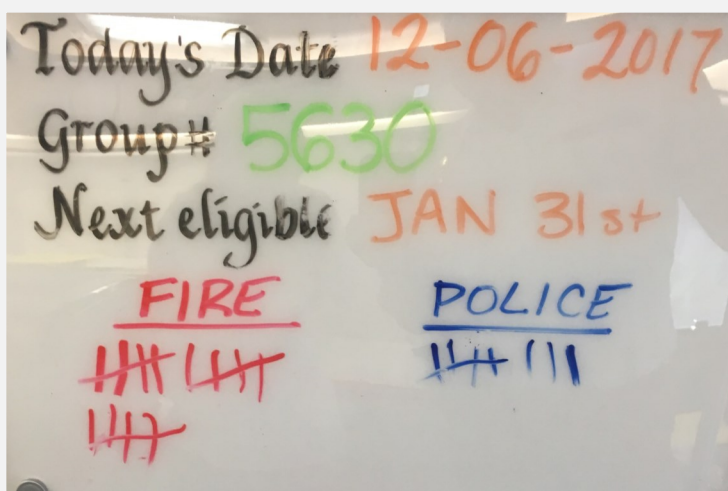

Danielle was born in Aberdeen and lived in Chehalis for 13 years before moving to Silverdale four years ago.

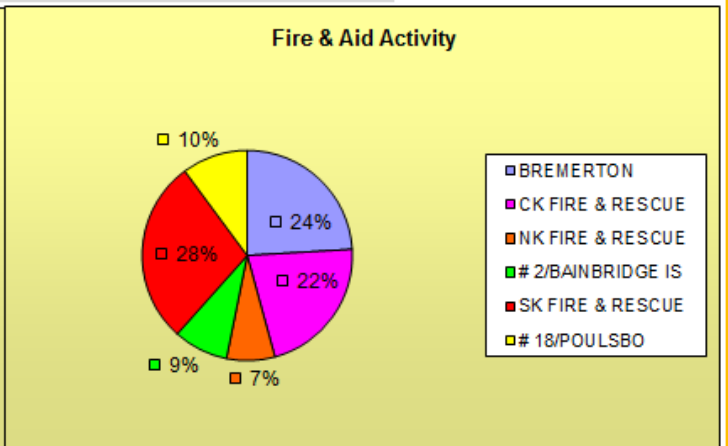
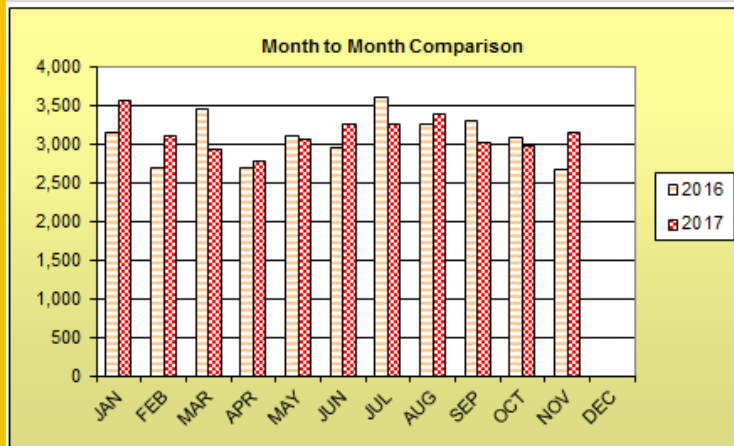

# Facilities update:

~ Chief Weninger

Lots of discussions going on about future CKFR capital facilities planning. Here are the facts to date:

1. During the recent Economic Summit, this group of internal stakeholders recommended pursuing a capital facilities bond to update, relocate and build new fire stations. Chief Sorenson is working with our architect of record to develop this capital facility plan. This is a complex project and completion timelines are still up in the air.
2. Silverdale Water and CKFR are 50% partners in Our Administrative campus (Pad one - Admin bldg., Pad two - maintenance bldg., pad three - vacant building site) Kitsap PUD is interested in becoming a partner in this Administrative complex and we are investigating the possibilities. CKFR has an interest in acquiring more floor space on pad two and this may all work into the larger discussions. No decisions have been made but many discussions are underway about collaborative possibilities on our administrative campus.
3. Construction estimates have been received regarding a remodel of the office space in our Pad two maintenance building to facilitate a relocation of Central Supply to the Admin Campus. The BOC will discuss this project on Monday night. Chief Danskin has lead on this project.
4. County Commissioner Ed Wolfe has invited Staff to discuss the possibility of a future public safety campus concept somewhere in the Silverdale area. Greeves Way has been suggested as a potential site for a future relocation of Station 51 and a KCSO reporting station complex. These discussions are in the very early stages and thus merely theoretical brainstorming at this point.
5. Ideas are great but, capital construction projects to improve our facilities cost real money. We will need to identify funding sources for some of these larger projects. More discussions to follow.



## Happy Holidays from A-Shift!

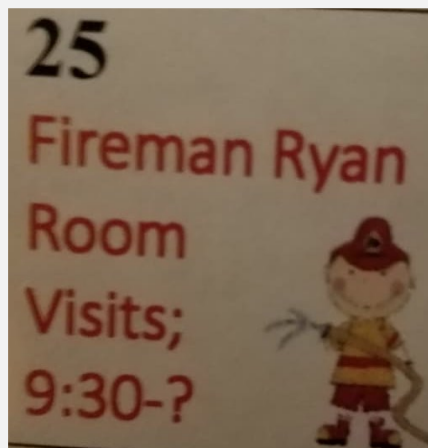
