Major Emergency Strategies and Tactics

On November 16-17, Chief Oliver instructed a course on strategies and tactics for major emergencies. BC and acting BC level officers from CKFR, Navy Region NW, Bremerton Fire Department, and Bainbridge Island Fire were represented.

Chief Oliver taught the curriculum for many years at the Metro Fire Officers class in Oregon, and throughout the region. This is a great class that goes beyond the initial Street Command class that Chief Oliver taught earlier this year.

This class has its foundations in the National Model of incident command and management that is taught at the National Fire Academy. This is about incident management from the big picture level.

Clean Audit Report

The Washington State Auditor's Office (SAO) recently completed its 2015-2016 audit of CKFR and will be issuing a clean audit report. Every two years the SAO performs an accountability audit to assess our use and safeguarding of public resources and a financial statement audit to ensure our annual financial statements are presented fairly. This time the SAO focused on the District's financial condition, payroll, self-insurance, cash receipting and ambulance fee refunds. Our next audit, covering 2017 and 2018, is scheduled for the fall of 2019.

At the exit conference, the auditors noted that District staff was very friendly and helpful in providing the information they requested. I want to echo this and add my thanks to everyone that helped make this audit a success!

According to FeedingAmerica.org, in Washington State, one in eight struggle with food insecurity. And for children, it's one in five who experience consistent hunger and food insecurity. The average cost of a meal in our county is \$2.98, which is up from last year. You can see that every bit of food we donate can make a big difference.

Central Kitsap Food Bank has struggled with recent vandalism. One two occasions, vandals cut fuel lines in two of their vans and stole fuel. Their ability to pick up food donations as well as their ability to deliver food to our senior citizens was greatly hampered. Also, it was a costly repair for their organization. They can use all the support we can give them.
