<u>Week 1 production on the first engine</u>: The cab is being welded together at the IPP facility and has shipped to the assembly plant to begin the paint process.

Week 1 production on the new water tender:

Currently in production at the Bradenton, FL facility. This week, the pump house structure was joined with the fire pump and the lower body was fabricated. Next week, the chassis may arrive and the pump house structure and body may begin the paint process.
