# **AP Reminders**

The deadline for getting invoices in for payment is 2:00 p.m. on the Monday prior to the BOC meeting.

All invoices to be paid and purchase card transactions must include the following:

- Either Operative IQ Purchase Order, Blue Slip, or TC-50 Multiple invoices may be included on the same PO or blue slip if they are for the same vendor
- Invoice (and W-9 if a new vendor)
- Packing Slip, if applicable. If no packing slip is included with the order, you must indicate which items were received on the documentation and initial.
- Other miscellaneous documentation as required to substantiate the purchase (e.g. signed contract, BOC memo, purchase method for equipment purchases over \$10K, etc.)

All purchase card documentation/receipts must be turned in immediately after the purchase per our <u>Purchasing SOP</u>.

### POLICY ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS WILL NOW BE PROCESSED THROUGH TARGET SOLUTIONS!

#### What's changing?

Effective immediately, only the acknowledgement piece of the process will transition to Target Solutions. CK Share will remain the repository for policies and other official documents (no change).

#### How will it work?

- When a policy is ready for acknowledgement, you will receive a "New Assignment Notification" email from <u>support@targetsolutions.com</u>. This will contain the name of the policy and a link to log onto Target Solutions.
- Upon logging on, you can access the policy acknowledgement(s) that have been assigned to you from the "Schedule" box on the Target Solutions homepage or the "My Assignments" tab on the left-side menu.
- Once you've read the policy, check to acknowledgement box, enter the date, and submit as complete.

#### Additional information:

- If you have not yet logged onto Target Solutions, it is important that you do so now by following the instructions in the attached memo (see Sam's email on 3/12/19).
- Please be sure that you've acknowledged all policies that have been assigned to you through CK Share up until March 1, 2019. Those acknowledgements will remain in CK share.

On Monday, members from CKFR had an opportunity to tour the construction site at the new Harrison Hospital Silverdale campus (thanks to Will Llewellyn and his brother-in-law who works on site). They hope to receive their first patient by the end of 2020.

The project is coming along nicely, with the current work focused on the exterior of the structure. The interior is partially complete and we were able to walk through the future ER, tower floors, heli-pad and much more.

Plus, we were given the opportunity to climb the construction crane! 7 members from CKFR took to the ladders to climb over 200 in the air (I think the top is about 227', plus another 10' or so for those that climbed to the top of the crow's nest). As you can see from the pictures, it could not have been a more spectacular day to climb!
