The Fire Chief Needs Your Help!

Central Kitsap Fire & Rescue is working hard to share information about a possible facilities bond for voter consideration. I wanted to remind you of how we got to this point, and ask for your assistance moving forward.

We spent two years assessing our fire stations to develop a Capital Facilities Plan. This process showed a glaring need for station projects to improve community safety and provide a healthier working environment for our firefighters.

We held meetings to take public input on the Plan before it was approved by our Board of Fire Commissioners last November. A copy of the Plan can be found on our website at www.ckfr.org. As part of the Plan, we looked at funding options. The cost of the station projects would exceed our daily operating levy, which is why a bond is being considered. But for how much?

The Plan identified \$64 million in needed improvements, and that was too much. Instead, we cut non-priority projects to reduce the amount to one that would result in a net tax decrease for taxpayers compared to what they were paying the District in 2019. We can do this because a Maintenance and Operations levy expired and we will pay off an old bond for apparatus before the facilities bond would take effect in 2021.

We called together our Citizen Advisory Committee to vet the idea of a bond and the amount. We had very positive feedback for both issues during our meeting this month.

The next step is to have the Board of Fire Commissioners consider a resolution to go to ballot and take public input again. This likely will happen sometime in March. If the resolution is approved, the bond proposal will be on voter ballots during the August 4 Primary Election.


