Approximately 4,000 people attend the nearly 5 hour event each year and are treated to live fire and car extrication demonstrations, over 40 booths, bounce houses, hot dogs grilled by firefighters, watching Airlift Northwest land, an opportunity to get a free, properly fitted bike helmet, and much more.

The response I've received so far to this decision has been positive. People understand the changes that need to be made in the world right now.

We're all in this situation together and we'll gather to celebrate 35 years next June.

Appropriate Use of Portable Media (CDs, DVDs, Flash Drives)



Portable media is an appropriate transport container.

Portable media is a convenient tool for transporting electronic records from one system to another, when they cannot be moved electronically.

Portable media is an appropriate backup container for disaster recovery purposes



Portable media should <u>NOT</u> be used as a way of storing public records.



There are two reasons for this:

- 1. Some portable media deteriorates.
- 2. Portable media becomes obsolete.
