Wear a life jacket; there's no excuse not to wear a lifejacket on the water! Boaters, kayakers, paddle boarders, enjoy the feel of sun and spray, so it's tempting not to wear a lifejacket especially on nice days. Even strong swimmers need to wear a life jacket. During an emergency, clothing can become heavy or waterlogged while in the water.

There are stocked life jacket loaner boards throughout Kitsap County. We encourage residents (young and old alike) to borrow a jacket for their day of fun on the water and return it when they're done so that others may stay safe.

CRITICAL DUE DATES

- July 22, 2020 Program managers and staff must submit budget requests to their respective supervisor or Chief for review and approval.
- July 31, 2020 All budget worksheet approved by Chiefs and supervisors are due to Finance.

DRS Announcement – Limited Customer Service Availability

The Washington State Department of Retirement Systems (DRS) will have reduced customer service availability in July due to mandatory furloughs of team members and high seasonal volumes of retirement processing.

Closed: July 2, 10, 17 and 24, 2020. Available for customer service questions via phone (800–547–6657) and emails on: June 29 and July 6, 13 and 20, 2020.

While DRS remains closed for in-person visits and onsite services, online services are still available. As always, customers can apply for retirement online.

Retirement applications and benefit payments continue to be processed per the usual schedule, however, in-person retirement planning workshops have been replaced with live online webinars covering the same topics.

DRS continues to monitor and promote health and safety for its team members, who are regularly updated on COVID-19 developments and best practices for slowing the spread of germs.
