Please note that figures included in the projected 2021 tax rates have been updated to include the most recent data available from Kitsap County. The information card that was mailed to all households was printed before the current figures were available. The projected total rate has decreased from \$2.18 to \$2.05 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.


Fire Ground Survival Training

On October 21-23 CKFR crews participated in fire ground survival training that consists of the most comprehensive survival skills and MAYDAY prevention program currently available within the fire service.

Fire fighters must be trained to perform potentially life-saving actions if they become lost, disoriented, injured, low on air or trapped. This training incorporates federal regulations, proven incident management best practices and survival techniques from leaders in the field, and real case studies from experienced fire fighters, the FGS program aims to educate all fire fighters to be prepared to survive critical fire ground events.

The purpose of the IAFF Fire Ground Survival program is to ensure that training for Mayday prevention and Mayday operations are consistent between all fire fighters, company officers and chief officers.

CKFR's new M41 and 51 are awaiting completion! They are built by Life Line in Sumner, Iowa. The projected completion date is in Mid November.




BOC MEETING
