
Lead Mechanic/EVT Promotion

Fall Protection System


SHOP SAFETY

Trench Course Update

Last week KSORT hosted a trench rescue technician course, bringing in MUSAR-TF, a training entity from Michigan that is recognized as one of the national leaders in trench rescue training. While we learned a lot of lessons from this experience regarding working with contractors, managing their timelines, and budget projection for unforeseen costs, the course was a resounding success. We were able to see 29 personnel trained to the level of technician, all but 5 of them from here in Kitsap County, and our existing technicians were able to learn some of the newest, safest, and most efficient techniques. Notably, there were several Kitsap firefighters who took the initiative to participate in the course, at their own cost, in order to improve their abilities and to qualify for future placement on the team. All personnel brought great attitudes and a solid work ethic to the table and directly contributed to the success of the course.

Smoke Alarms - NFPA.org



Smoke alarms save lives. Smoke alarms that are properly installed and maintained play a vital role in reducing fire deaths and injuries. If there is a fire in your home, smoke spreads fast and you need smoke alarms to give you time to get out.

Here's what you need to know!

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire. Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home.
- Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- Test your smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- When a smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside.
- Replace all smoke alarms in your home every 10 years.
