Plan of action

Central Kitsap is experiencing tremendous growth. This growth is seen in the commercial core as well as the surrounding suburban areas. Central Kitsap Fire and Rescue is well positioned with new apparatus and equipment funded through an apparatus and equipment bond and the apparatus replacement fund. The fire district is in the process of upgrading or rebuilding all the district facilities funded, primarily by the 2020 facilities bond. The final phase it to improve staffing of fire apparatus. Through the strategic planning process, the district is planning to responsibly improve our daily staffing levels to achieve three-person fire apparatus staffing. This will bring more personnel to the scene sooner. When consistent 3-person staffing is achieved there will be less apparatus required to mitigate an incident, thereby increasing the reliability of other apparatus and stations.
